Richmond Family Place Promotes Family Navigation



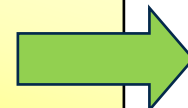
Through relationships, staff members orient families in their day-to-day community life



Richmond Family Place provides support to families. Resilience and capacity are built through connections and use existing strengths to develop new skills



Richmond Family Place promotes community belonging based on respect and inclusion. Programs help newcomers and vulnerable families create social support systems.



WE PROVIDE

An inclusive environment that welcomes diversity. We support & guide families through life's challenges. We assist in building social connections. We provide an environment where families establish networks of support, building protective & resiliency factors. We use social media, including Richmond Family Place & Richmond Kids websites to promote resource navigation.

Purposeful relationship building, in a strength based, safe environment. Drop in programs throughout Richmond, reducing isolation and barriers to access. 14 staff supporting families to access basic needs (food, clothing etc.) & community resources & referrals.

Building parenting skills through education programs, parent to parent connection & conversations with Family Support Workers during all programs. ECE trained staff deliver play based learning in a stimulating environment that promotes the parent-child relationship through play over a wide variety of programs.

A welcoming environment of mutual respect & learning. Multi lingual staff including trained cultural brokers. Assisting to form networks of social support. Creating opportunities to volunteer at Richmond Family Place & the wider community.

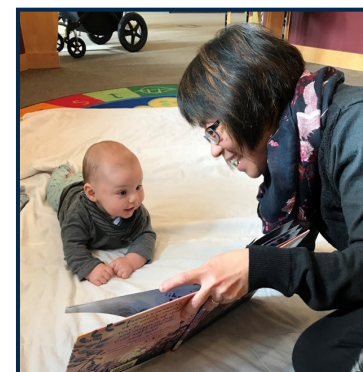
